<p>GREAT: Getting Ready for Employment and Training (family support)</p> <p>This project supports individuals in families who have multiple and complex barriers to training or employment and live with children of school age. They may be at risk of social exclusion and will be furthest from the labour market.</p> <p>The project provides 1 to 1 support via Employment Support Officers alongside activities provided by delivery partners to progress participants towards training and work. Leicestershire (support for people in rural areas) Work.Live.Leicestershire (WiLL) helps people who are economically inactive and unemployed living in rural Leicestershire to move into job search, training, volunteering, employment, and self-employment. Each participant is allocated a keyworker, who keeps in regular contact. Due to Covid we are currently working remotely by providing support via phone, email, video calls. We offer support with CV writing, job searching, training courses, interview coaching and signposting to other support as needed. Adults	<p>Moneywise Plus: Digital and Financial Inclusion Moneywise plus provides free digital and financial support to individuals across Leicester and Leicestershire to help them move closer to the labour market. The project supports people who are not in work or are economically inactive to achieve their employment goals. Moneywise Plus advisers provide tailored, 1-2-1 practical support to help individuals negotiate the daily challenges we all face, whether its accessing and managing Universal credit; personal budgeting; setting up and using an email account; using electronic devices, job searching online and CV writing. o Increasing financial skills and confidence –personal money management, opening a bank account, mobile/internet banking, and maximising income where possible e.g. utility switching. o Increasing digital skills and confidence –skills in using computers, using the internet safely, staying in touch with family and friends, accessing online services and using pc's tablets and devices.</p> <p>COVID 19 support: Taking referrals, MW+ team is working remotely and working to provide support via the phone, and online digitally.</p>	<p>Reaching People, a local consortium of voluntary and third sector organisations within Leicester and Leicestershire, are delivering the Moneywise Plus programme.</p> <p>For further information on the project, Call 0300 003 7004 Email info@moneywiseplus.co.uk Web www.moneywiseplus.co.uk</p> <p>Delivery ends on 31 December 2022.</p>

<p>Adults</p>	<p>Links to Work</p> <p>The Links to Work programme supports people aged 25 or over with barriers into sustainable employment. Participants must be legally resident and have the right to take paid employment in the UK. <u>Eligibility:</u> Clients must be unemployed or inactive and fall into one or more of the following categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Long term unemployed or inactive (26 weeks or longer) * Basic Skills need (below NVQ Level 1 or equivalent) * Have more than one barrier to employment <p>Customers are assigned a Personal Consultant who will support them for their duration on programme. Customers are helped via 1:1's and workshop settings with access to a Health Facilitator, Tutor and Employment Consultant. <p>Aged 16 plus</p>	<p>Skills Support for the Unemployed (sector-based initiatives for those aged 16 plus)</p> <p>Working with 1528 unemployed 16+ year olds, delivering education and training that helps unemployed and inactive people to enter sustained employment across the LLEPs eight key growth sectors.</p> <p>The aim of the service is to deliver bespoke support and vocational training, complemented by work experience or work "tasters". Community Grants (initiatives to move people into the labour market)

Jointly funded by the ESFA and ESF, Community Grants **give small voluntary and community organisations** with a turnover of less than £500,000 an opportunity to access funds to deliver projects that help engage and progress 'hard to reach' individuals towards the labour market.

The grants will support participants' progression so that they are confident in their ability to move into employment.
